

Household Emergency Plan

Answer the following questions to help your family be better prepared.

Where will we meet our family members if we can't get into or stay in our home?

Suggested that you organise a number of alternative locations and list them.

Where will we stay if we are evacuated?

Are you able to arrange these details at the time or do you need to pre-identify them?

Who will collect the children from school if we are unable to get there?

Make sure that you have informed your children, they have agreed to do this and you have their contact details. You may need to inform the school of these arrangements.

Which neighbours will we check on in an emergency?

Note their contact details. Are you able to get keys to access the premises?

Who do we need to tell that we are safe?

Make a list of people and their contact numbers. Have a hard copy available, as well as the numbers inputted onto your mobile phone.

Has everyone included an ICE (In Case of Emergency) contact number in their mobile phone? (This can be used by the Emergency Services to contact your family members, if needed).
